I am Full Professor of Economic Policy at Scuola Normale Superiore, Dipartimento di scienze politico-sociali, Firenze. My research themes include international political economy, the causes and consequences of inequality, the relationships between innovation, growth and employment, economic and industrial policies in Europe.

I have worked in international institutions as a Ph.D. student at the London School of Economics (LSE); as a research fellow at Columbia University, New York; as a visiting scholar at the University of Cambridge, at the European University Institute, at the LSE, at the Université Paris 1, Panthéon Sorbonne. I have worked in several Italian institutions, including the National Research Council in Rome, the Università di Urbino Carlo Bo, Università Roma Tre.

I have been a member of the *Centro Linceo Interdisciplinare 'Beniamino Segre'* of the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei. I have carried out research in cooperation with the European Commission, the OECD, ILO, UNRISD, UNIDO, MIUR and the Bank of Italy.
